



BRAVO 219

Bravo 219 is a 1985 Mobile Medical Type III ambulance, remounted on a 2006 Ford, E450 chassis. The unit was purchased in early 2006 with a \$70,775 grant from the Department of Homeland Security, through the Assistance to Firefighters Grant program. OAFR was one of only 4 EMS agencies in the State to receive the grant. The vehicle is licensed by the State of Michigan as a Basic Life Support (BLS) transport ambulance and carries a Cardiac Science automatic defibrillator, epi-pens, combitube airway devices and features extendable flood-lights on the front of the box to provide lighting for nighttime scenes. The rig also is equipped with a complete set of Amkus Hydraulic Rescue tools, extrication suits, Coleman generator, Stryker cot and stokes rescue basket. The ambulance features a custom extended cab for extra storage behind the seats and heavy duty grill guard. The unit uses a Motorola VHF and 800 MHZ radio and cell phone for communications.

Tango 218 is a 2001 Chevrolet Tahoe 4X4. The unit was purchased in early 2001 with a \$20,000 State grant that required a \$20,000 local match. The vehicle is licensed by the State of Michigan to provide non-transporting Basic Life Support (BLS) and also carries a Cardiac Science automatic defibrillator, epi-pens, combitube airways and features an Odyssey Automotive EMS conversion package to safely store and transport all supplies and equipment.
